


Options

- Keep the status quo. Council handles the interview and hiring process.
- 2. Council authorizes someone else to:
 - a. Make the hiring decision
 - One person
 - Two or more persons
 - b. Make a hiring recommendation
 - The top-rated candidate
 - A top-rated group of candidates




Public Meetings Law

- Two or more persons who together decide on behalf of the Beaverton City Council who to hire constitute a public body. The interview and hiring process are likely subject to the public meetings law.
- The same is true if the group only advises the Beaverton City Council on whom to hire.
- When two or more persons meet to advise a single person on whom to hire, and that person then advises the Beaverton City Council on whom to hire, all hiring, interviewing, and decision-making stages involving the council are likely subject to the public meetings law.



"One person does not a public body make."



A single person who is fully authorized to independently decide who to hire is not a public body. The interview and hiring process the person uses is not subject to the public meetings law.

The Amending Resolution

The proposed resolution amending resolution 4702:

- Establishes a new hiring process for associate judges.
- Continues the council's existing hiring process for the city manager, the city attorney, the municipal court's presiding judge.
- Authorizes the presiding judge to appoint, manage, and remove the municipal court's associate and pro-tem judges. No formal council approval is required for the presiding judge to act.
- May be amended or repealed at any time by majority vote of the council.
