

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to appropriate Tranche 1 of ARPA funding in the amount of \$5,430,935 for various community investment initiatives as follows:





 - Equity and inclusion learning and development for new/existing staff
 - Increase hiring and retention of underrepresented individuals
 - Create initial **Equity Dashboard** to communicate equity data, including recruitment and hiring demographics

Homeless Shelter Predevelopment: \$50,000 In support of development and construction of a year-round shelter within Beaverton
