Project Background

Long-standing City priority

2035 Transportation System Plan (TSP)

Supports Community Vision



Project Goal

Realign, redesign and rebuild Millikan Way between Watson and Lombard

- Parallel route north of Canyon
- Pedestrian and bicycle friendly environment
- Support downtown activities and redevelopment



Project Background: Existing Conditions

- Doesn't connect to Lombard
- Sharp curve limits sight distance
- Inadequate sidewalks



Project Background: Existing Conditions

- Driveways create conflict points
- Watson and Hall difficult to cross
- Major bikeway




Project Background

2017: Investigation of alignment options

2019: City Council requested more information for decision

2021: Restart work on project



Project Needs

- Confirm goals and objectives
- Gather existing conditions inventory
- Develop and evaluate design alternatives
- Conduct meaningful community engagement



Project Phases

Phase 1: Planning and Project Development

Phase 2: Preliminary Engineering

Phase 3: Right of Way Acquisition

Phase 4: Construction



Project Funding

\$9.4 million MSTIP 3e available for all project phases

Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Washington County:

- City to lead and deliver the project
- Washington County transfers funds with each phase
- City responsible for project costs beyond \$9.4 million

Initial contract:

- Phase 1: Planning and Project Development
- KPFF Consulting Engineers: \$520,000, 19-month duration
- City Council: Consider approval on 2/15/22


Negotiate separate contracts or change orders for subsequent phases
