
## PROJECT PURPOSE



### WHY A FACILITIES MASTER PLAN?

## **City facilities can be:**

- In need of rehabilitation or expensive to maintain
- Poorly located or configured
- Inflexible or obsolete
- Undersized or inadequate for growth in service demand
- Poorly utilized
- Vulnerable to natural disasters or emergencies



## WHY A FACILITIES MASTER PLAN?

#### **Smart**

• Strategically addresses deficiencies and manages City property

#### **Proactive**

Anticipates growth and constraints

#### **Transformative**

• Reflects organizational culture and jumpstarts transformation



### A FACILITIES MASTER PLAN...

#### A Facilities Plan does not...

- X Evaluate operations outside of a facilities context
- X Correct today's maintenance difficulties
- Design a facility, produce construction documents, or eliminate environmental review
- X Guarantee funding for facilities projects


#### A Facilities Plan does...

- Analyze operational efficiency related to physical infrastructure
- Look forward and plan for growth and change
- Build consensus, inform decision-making, and build support for funding

## **KEY CHALLENGES**

- Underutilized space in the Griffith Building

- Traffic congestion impedes City service accessibility and staff operational efficiency
- Evolving office space use patterns
